Bernie Sammons currently serves as the Co-Chair of the Voice of the Poor Committee of the St. Vincent de Paul Society. In 2016, Bernie founded Social Justice 4 All to assist the needy in the St. Louis area, with a focus on housing, education and employment. He has recently worked with Catholic Charities of St. Louis and the Missouri Catholic Conference to successfully advocate for the "benefits cliff" legislation that will help low-income families meet their basic needs while encouraging individuals to find work and advance within their job.

When their son Charlie was born with Down syndrome, Carnie and Maura Nulton dreamed of him attending his local Catholic school with his siblings and friends. They gathered a group of like-minded parents and together started the FIRE Foundation, an organization that provides grants to Catholic schools to hire special educators and paraprofessionals and to acquire learning materials and technology that create successful learning experiences for all children. For over 25 years, FIRE and the Nultons have supported Catholic education in an inclusive environment for thousands of children in the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph and have advocated for inclusion in Catholic schools nationwide.
