

2025 Session of the Missouri General Assembly

This report gives the final status of MCC position bills. Bills reported as "Truly Agreed and Finally Passed," have been approved by the Missouri General Assembly and await action by the governor. The governor has until July 14, 2025, to sign or veto bills.

Protect Human Life

Abortion Drug Mandate
