Welcome and Accompany Immigrants and Refugees

Missouri Illegal Alien Certified Bounty Hunter Program

Original Bill: [SB480](#) **Amended Bill:** **Sponsor:** Sen. David Gregory (R)

Description: Creates criminal procedure provisions regarding the offense of trespass by an illegal alien. Legislation only goes into effect if SB 72 passes.

The bill also implements the "Missouri Illegal Alien Certified Bounty Hunter Program", which would certify applicants to be bounty hunters for the purpose of finding and detaining illegal aliens in the state. Additionally, the bill mandates an information system for people to report illegal aliens (toll-free telephone hotline, email, and online portal), rewarding them with \$1,000 for every person who is arrested.
