Description: To appropriate money for the Department of Social Services and several divisions and programs. Section 11.830 provides \$113 million for the Show-Me Healthy Babies program. This includes funding for prenatal care and related services for pregnant women and their unborn children.

Solutions for Food Deserts

Original Bill: [HB1520](#) **Amended Bill:** **Sponsor:** Rep. Dane Diehl (R)

Description: Modifies provisions of the urban farm tax credit to include certain specialty crop farms located in a food desert and establishes a tax credit for grocery stores in a food desert.

Position: Support
